CBK gearing towards Integrated Management System

The CBK Power management decided to implement an Integrated Management System (IMS) after almost four years of implementing Quality Management System (QMS), Environmental Management System (EMS) and Safety and Health Management System (SHMS) at the Kalayaan Pumped Storage Power Plant .

Already, an IMS Team was created, headed by the IMS Steering Committee with the Chief Officer for Operations and Maintenance (COOM) as chairman and the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO), VP for Operation and Maintenance (VP-O&M), VP for Environment and Community Relations (VP-ECRG) and the three plant managers as members. The Steering Committee will ensure that the IMS is established, implemented and continually improved to meet company goals and objectives. The VP-ECRG was appointed as the IMR with the three plant managers designated as deputy IMR for their respective power plants. As IMR, they will ensure that the IMS in CBK and their respective power plants is effectively implemented and maintained. The IMRs coordinate among themselves regarding IMS promotional plans and improvement for implementation in respective plant.

Supporting the IMRs is the IMS Technical Team composed of the following: QMR for each power plant, and deputy ESHMRs for KPSP, CHEPP and BHEPP, CBK- EMR, and the Safety Officer CBK-ESHMR. This technical team is responsible for the planning, scheduling, coordinating and implementing IMS project activities of plants and departments.

Greetings!

KPSPP re-certified to ISO 9001: 2000 & 14001:2004

The Kalayaan Pumped Storage Power Plant (KPSPP) gained re-certification to ISO 9001:2000 and the new version of ISO 14001:2004 after the recertification audit conducted by TÜV Management Service last March 29 – 31, 2006.

The re-certification confirmed that the KPSPP is diligently implementing the Environmental Management System (EMS) and the Quality Management System (QMS) since the two (2) systems were certified in March 2003 to ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, respectively. It also shows that EMS and QMS are already in the mindset of CBK personnel and could be perceived as already an integral part of processes and activity within the KPSPP.

CBK aimed for ISO-certification of its EMS and QMS not only for recognition that it is at par with the best companies in the world but also as a means to further improve its operation and enhance benefits that could be derived from its operation not only by the CBK personnel but also by the host communities. Even with the more than three years of implementation, the company is still looking for ways and means to further improve its environment and ensure the sustainability of the available resources.

Prior to the recertification, a combined QMS and EMS Internal Audit was conducted to determine the status and effectiveness of the systems implementation. During the

internal audit, the auditors focused on how the systems implementation could improve the performance of an activity or a process unlike in the previous audits wherein the focus was in checking if CBK personnel are diligently following the manuals, procedures, and other documented or established instructions.

For the QMS, it was noted that some of the equipment being used in the operation of KPSPP are not yet calibrated although most of the equipment are already scheduled for calibration. Thus, it was decided that monitoring of equipment calibration will be included in the Key Performance Measure (KPM) and other existing documented monitoring activities to ensure that the scheduled calibration activities will be completed on-time. Other minor observations are mostly related on documents and records control such as lapses in signing records and submission of records to the concerned department.

For EMS, most of the findings are related to non-usage of required forms for monitoring the generation of hazardous wastes, lapses in maintaining records of equipment operation with potential significant environmental aspects. Other lapses that are observed in the area are the non-cognizance of the responsible persons for the management of hazardous substances and / or wastes, and consequently, other

personnel role, responsibilities and authorities in case of environmental emergency.

Based on the general assessment of findings, it was recommended that a reorientation be conducted to refresh the mind of CBK personnel on emergency response plans to make them prepared in case an emergency situation arises. It is also being envisioned that an emergency drill would be conducted, whenever practicable, to make the personnel feel and react in such emergency situation.

Despite the certification of existing EMS to ISO 14001:1996 and some additional provisions of ISO 14001:2004 as compared to the previous ISO 14001 standard, the TUV still found the EMS implementation to be in conformance with the new ISO 14001 Standard. Some of the minor observations and / or suggestions for

improvement based on the requirements of the new standard include: to add the specific environmental regulation pertaining to the identified environmental aspect; to require concerned CBK management and personnel to indicate the date of signing EMS document and record; and review some of the EMS forms and consider integrating the EMS forms whenever applicable to minimize documentation and facilitate EMS implementation.

For the overall assessment, most of the observations noted by the TUV auditors are new lapses which they did not observe during the previous audits. This signifies that CBK has been implementing measures not only to prevent the recurrence of the nonconformities noted by the TUV auditors but most importantly, to improve the EMS implementation.

For both management systems, the TUV auditors recommended that the procedure and guidelines on internal audit should be further strengthened by explicitly identifying the activities for checking the effectiveness of corrective actions and preventive actions, establish criteria for the selection of Lead Auditor, and include observations and/or rooms for improvement on the items to be followed-up by the internal auditors.

As a parting note, the TUV Auditors advised CBK to deliberate on the certification of its facilities (KPSPP I & II, CHEPP, and BHEPP) into Integrated Management System (IMS) considering that EMS, QMS and SHMS are already being implemented in the three facilities although the SHMS of CHEPP and BHEPP are still not certified to OHSAS 18001:1999.

When J-Power and Sumitomo Corporation acquired CBK Power in April 2005, Suzuki was appointed VP for O&M, with a 23-year experience in J-Power in the field of maintenance of hydroelectric power plants. He obtained his Electrical Engineering degree in Chuo University in Japan.

Saito joined J-Power in 1995 as Engineering Staff of the Substation Engineering Section, Electric Engineering Department and moved to various positions in the company until his appointment in 2004 as Assistant Manager of the Power Engineering Business Office, International Business Department.

He has a Master of Engineering degree at the Shinsu University Graduate School. He also took a Power

Systems Engineering Course in General Electric in Schenectady, United States in 2001-2002.

Yasuda returned to the head office of J-Power in Tokyo, Japan to supervise the company's overseas projects as Senior Advisor to the Director of the International Power Business Department. He promised to continue providing support to CBK Power's operations from the Tokyo office.

In a message sent from Tokyo, Yasuda said, "I heard that Kalayaan has been in a far better situation than in the past. Also, there are no more serious problems in Caliraya and Botocan. It is a remarkable achievement of all CBK employees and I would like to appreciate your efforts for this progress. I promise you that I will continue providing back-up support for CBK from Tokyo. BHEPP and CHEPP retain ISO 9001 and ISO 14001 Certification

The Botocan Hydroelectric Power Plant (BHEPP) and Caliraya Hydroelectric Power Plant (CHEPP) successfully passed the second annual surveillance audit conducted by TÜV Management Service last November 13 – 14, 2006 for their Quality Management System (QMS) and Environmental Management System (EMS) certification to ISO 9001:2000 and ISO 14001:2004.

The surveillance audit confirmed that the personnel in the two power plants are conducting their activities in accordance with the documented procedures and guidelines for EMS and QMS since the issuance of ISO-certification in November 2004.

For the QMS, it was noted that most of the equipment being used in the operation of CHEPP are not yet calibrated although the equipment are already scheduled for c

For BHEPP, only a few equipment were not calibrated as scheduled. Just like the internal audit at KPSPP, lapses in signing records and oversight in the submission of records to the concerned department are also noted in the two power plants.

For EMS in the two power plants, most of the findings were lapses in maintaining records of assessed environmental aspect /

impact and monitoring of hazardous wastes generation. Additional minor observation at BHEPP was the non-availability of some monthly monitoring records on environmental program implementation. Another lapse observed at BHEPP and CHEPP was the non-awareness of newly-hired Security personnel about EMS implementation.

Based on the general assessment of findings, an EMS orientation of the subcontractors was conducted to make them aware of the EMS and their role in its implementation. For lapses on records control, a discussion with the BHEPP management was done to designate an alternate EMS Document Controller Officer (DCO) since the EMS records and documents were not available during the time of the internal audit due to the non-availability / absence of the DCO.

During the surveillance audit, the TUV auditors reiterated their recommendation for improvement during the KPSPP recertification. Furthermore, they suggested that the identified environmental aspects and impacts during abnormal condition be further classified between emergency and abnormal condition as another point for improvement of the EMS implementation.

The IMS Documentation Committee was also established and will be responsible for the design and development of IMS Manual, integrating ESH provisions to existing procedures manual and work instructions, and incorporating ESH performance requirements to the Key Performance Measures (KPM). The committee is composed mostly of department managers and key personnel in a section / group. Lastly, the IMS Internal Auditors Team is composed of the present CBK Internal Auditors who already attended at least one external training on auditing of a specific management system.

Having different standards to comply with is likely to result in extensive paperwork and confusion between demands of the individual standards. From a management system point of view, it would be appropriate to merge the three types of management systems into one system, because it reduces duplicate work and bureaucracy. Thus, the IMS is envisioned to facilitate the system implementation since it will make use of the common areas of the standards, namely internal audits, document and records control, management review, corrective action, training, organization and responsibility.

The advantages for this are clear, namely: stimulation of business improvement through waste reduction both in the operation of the processes and management systems; removal of duplication; risk reduction; and removal of barriers between departments and functions. These will all add to a company's competitive

advantage. The disadvantages are that by reducing specialization, expertise becomes more general.

The IMS will contribute to the CBK's sustainability by offering a system that not only provides a means to focus business energy, but also monitors its progress in attaining the organization's business objectives and targets. IMS improvement goals will be monitored monthly to determine its efficacy in creating cost-saving strategies, equipment efficiency, zero accident and reducing wastage of resources. Key to success is having clear, simple targets that provide measurable outcomes and milestones along the way.

Some possible problems that may arise include: priority and importance of normal business operation supersede the IMS implementation process and risk of neglecting concerns pertaining to a department / section while focusing only on the corporate wide issues.

Summing up, an IMS consists of the core elements in the standards like policy, planning, implementation and management review as well as a common handbook with the documentation of procedures, work instructions, guidelines, etc. However, this is just the system – in order to make it work at CBK there is a common challenge regarding management commitment, employee motivation and participation, stakeholder involvement, and a focus on continuous improvements of the performance in the different areas. In other words, changing the CBK's organizational culture and tradition might be the real challenge compared to building up an integrated system.

CBK, NPC establish Flood Forecasting and Warning System

CBK Power and the National Power Corporation (NPC) recently established the Flood Forecasting and Warning System (FFWS) that sets the guidelines and rules on how to operate the Caliraya and Botocan dams.

The objective of the Flood Forecasting and Warning System (FFWS) is to provide NPC and CBK a real-time hydrological information upstream of the watershed and enable them to determine the present and expected condition of the Caliraya reservoir for NPC and Botocan reservoir for CBK, thereby optimizing water usage. It will also forewarn people living on the downstream area of the reservoirs of impending water release from the New Caliraya and Botocan spillways through the fixed warning stations, which are located at strategic places, to avoid any untoward incident that may occur in the course of the spilling operation.

The FFWS is a component of the Integrated Emergency Response Plan (iERP) wherein the role and responsibilities of concerned parties such as CBK, NPC, PAGASA, local government agencies and disaster coordinating councils (DCCs) from provincial to barangay levels are stipulated.

In the development of the operation manuals customized for the Caliraya and Botocan reservoirs, inflow forecast models will be utilized to have sufficient lead time for the community to react and prepare for any upcoming disaster related to floods. Integral to the development of the model are input data related to the stream, watershed and rainfall.

A survey was conducted by PAGASA and NPC personnel to gather inputs to the development of the inflow forecast models as well as in the development of FFWS general manual.

To commence the model development, cross-section at

eight (8) points along the rivers of Balanac and Pagsanjan was measured which will be used as the representative cross-sections in the simulation of streamflow using the model being developed.

A total of four rainfall stations were established to gather daily rainfall data that will be used in the development of simulation model. The model will predict the water inflow to the dam / reservoir and the corresponding water level. The output of this model will be used to predict if water from the dam / reservoir will reach critical water level that will necessitate water spilling. The four rainfall stations are located in Brgy. San Antonio in Kalayaan, Brgys. Lumot and Udia in Cavinti, and Botocan Dam in Majayjay. It is also anticipated that the automatic rainfall station in Lucban, Quezon will be reactivated soon since most of the inflow to Botocan Dam are coming from this area which is along the footslope of Mt. Banahaw.

Two river stage monitoring sites were established in Brgy. Suba in Majayjay and Brgy. Uno in Lumban about 2.6 km. downstream of the confluence point of Balanac and Pagsanjan Rivers. The two stations serve as reference points in which relationship between the two water levels are to be investigated and threshold values for alert-alarm critical levels will be derived.

Presently, the consultants are on the final stage of gathering primary data that are still needed for the operation of the simulation model such as a map of telemetered network that will be installed showing the stations of rainfall, water level and warning system.

CBK inks MOA with NPC and LLDA for P2.6M reforestation project

CBK Power recently signed a Memorandum of Agreement with the National Power Corporation (NPC) and the Laguna Lake Development Authority (LLDA) for the reforestation of 40 hectares of land in the Caliraya-Lumot Watershed, amounting to P2.6 million.

Under the cost-sharing arrangement agreed upon by the three parties, the LLDA will provide P1 million for the reforestation project and CBK Power and NPC will put up a counterpart funding of P800,000 each.

The reforestation of the Caliraya-Lumot Watershed is one of the major components of the MOA, signed last July 10, for the sale and purchase of verified emission reductions (VERs) from the reforestation project. The sale and purchase of VERs (defined as carbon emissions verified by the Designated Operational Entity) will be implemented under the Laguna de Bay Community Carbon Finance Project, also known as the Carbonshed Project.

The MOA was signed by CBK Power President and Chief Executive Officer Masahiro Ikezawa, NPC President Cyril del Callar and LLDA General Manager Casimiro Ynarez III.

Based on the MOA, the LLDA will determine if the reforestation project complies with the Clean Development Mechanism (CDM) rules of the Kyoto Protocol. If the

project does, then the LLDA will endorse it to the Department of Environment and Natural Resources which, in turn, will endorse it for financing by the World Bank Bio-Carbon Fund.

The reforestation project is the first to be registered as a CDM project in the Philippines under the Land Use and Land Use Change, Forestry category. It is also only the second such undertaking in the world, next to the CDM project that was registered in China.

Under the CDM rules, industrialized countries pay for projects that reduce greenhouse gases (GHG) emissions in developing countries. In return, these industrialized countries are given "emission credits" which can also use or apply in meeting their own emission targets. Under the Kyoto Protocol, developed countries are obliged to reduce their collective GHG emissions by at least five percent between 2008 and 2012.

Apart from the 40 hectares covered by the three-way cost-sharing arrangement, the MOA also calls for the reforestation of an additional 100 hectares in the Caliraya-Lumot Watershed and another 50 hectares in the Makiling-Banahaw Watershed, also in Laguna. The reforestation of the additional 150 hectares will be funded through the Universal Levy Fund-Environmental Charge allowed by the Electric Power Industry Reform Act. comply with ISO 9001, ISO 14001 and OHSAS 18001. CBK will even improve the established processes, systems, programs and procedures to be able to launch the Integrated Management System (IMS) this year.

Since its establishment in 2001, CBK has been a good corporate citizen in the host communities. Now, we are financially contributing to the host communities by paying local business tax, real property tax, and the DOE Energy Regulations 1-94 contributions. In 2007, CBK will start to pay corporate income tax to the National Government. I believe the payment of taxes is the most fundamental and basic Corporate Social Responsibility.

I hope the new year will be a great year to CBK to achieve these activities. We cannot afford to fail our duty for the survival in the next 20 years of the contractual years. With your support, CBK will survive for another two decades to provide the same benefits to the employees, host communities, and sponsors.
