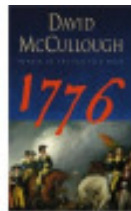

 Enjoyed by all



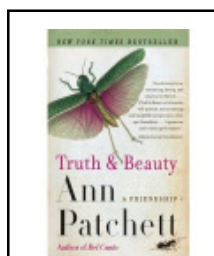
February 15

 Robinson has been a popular book club author. This was good, but not as good as "Housekeeping"



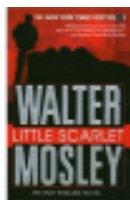
October 19

 A fluff read, amusing, but not stimulating



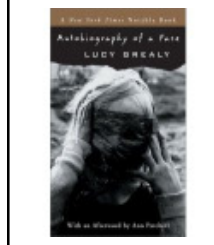
March 15

 Excellent read, well written, but should be read with the next book



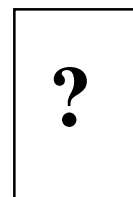
June 21

 We generally don't read mysteries. Okay, but not good for discussion.

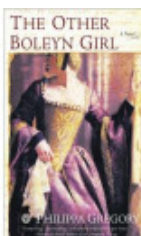


"Autobiography of a Face"
