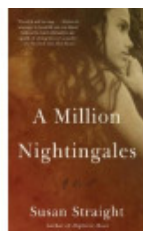

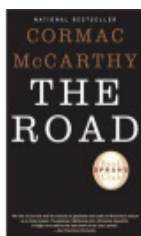
September 19

 Our classics read for this year.



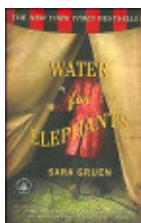
October 17

 Glimpse into everyday life in Israel, and terrorism. Based on a true story.



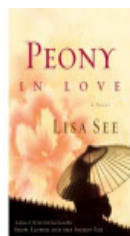
November 14
