Safety Tips

Personal Lightning Safety Tips

1. **Plan in advance your evacuation and safety measures.** When you first see lightning or hear thunder, activate your emergency plan. Now is the time to go to a building or a vehicle. Lightning often precedes rain, so don't wait for the rain to begin before suspending activities.
2. **If outdoors, avoid water. Avoid the high ground. Avoid open spaces.** Avoid all metal objects including electric wires, fences, machinery, motors, power tools, etc. Unsafe places include underneath canopies, small picnic or rain shelters, or near trees. Where possible, find shelter in a substantial building or in a fully enclosed metal vehicle such as a car, truck, or a van with the windows completely shut. If lightning is striking nearby when you are outside, you should:
 - **Crouch down**, put feet together, place hands over ears to minimize hearing damage from thunder.
 - **Avoid proximity** (minimum of 15 ft.) to other people.
3. **If indoors, avoid water.** Stay away from doors and windows. Do not use the telephone. Take off head sets. Turn off, unplug, and stay away from appliances, computers, power tools, and TV sets. Lightning may strike exterior electric and phone lines, inducing shocks in inside equipment.
4. **Suspend activities** for 30 minutes after the last observed lightning or thunder.
5. **Injured persons** do not carry an electrical charge and can be handled safely. Apply first aid procedures to a lightning victim if you are qualified to do so. Call 911 or send for help immediately.
6. **Know your emergency telephone numbers.**



Noteworthy: Arrests and Violent Crimes



On April 26, 2011 at approximately 7:15pm Officer Dan Disney and Sergeant Paul Arkins were sent on a 911 emergency call to the "Ten Nails" Fingernail salon located at 3654 South East Street on report of a trouble with an intoxicated person refusing to leave. Upon arrival Sergeant Arkins found an unconscious and unresponsive female (later identified as Stacy Farmer) sitting in a chair inside the salon. Employee's said she had been unconscious for about 20 minutes. A paramedic ambulance was requested. Sergeant Arkins attempted to awaken Ms. Farmer and got no response however she had a pulse and had labored breathing. Shortly thereafter Officer Disney arrived and within minutes the Ms. Farmer stopped breathing. Officer Disney and Sergeant Arkins laid her flat on the floor and Officer Disney began mouth to mouth resuscitation (which he continued for over 7 minutes until just before the medics arrived) while Sergeant Arkins monitored her pulse. Due to Officer Disney's unselfish life saving act Ms. Farmer began breathing again just before the ambulance arrived. Farmer was transported to St. Francis Hospital for further treatment

On April 26, 2011 at approximately 8:12pm officers responded to Don Pablo's restaurant, 8150 South US 31, to assist an off duty officer. Officer Nate Harves (Whitestown PD) stated he was in the restaurant when he heard an argument between Karen Cornelius (white female age 48) and Gary Cornelius (white male age 45). Officer Harves identified himself as a police officer and asked both parties involved to go with him to the front of the restaurant to wait for on duty officers. While waiting, Gary Cornelius became combative and pushed Officer Harves in the chest several times. Karen Cornelius grabbed Officer Harves by the arm causing pain. Officers arrived on the scene and placed Karen and Gary Cornelius under arrest for battery on a law enforcement, resisting law enforcement, public intoxication, and disorderly conduct.

On April 27th Southeast District Day Tac NROs, assisted by Day Shift and East District Officer Brenda Samm, conducted a vice detail in the 4600 Block of E Washington Street. In spite of the rainy weather, this detail made 9 arrests for patronizing a prostitute. One of the subjects arrested was a Richard Gray, W M DOB 04-20-1976 who is registered with Johnson County as a sexually violent predator.

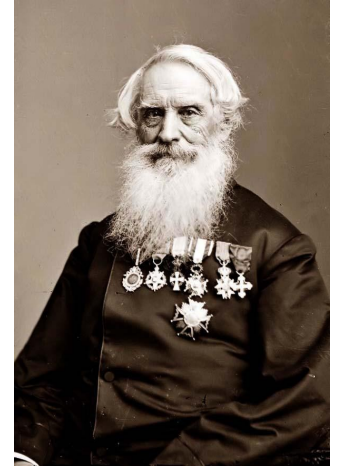
On April 27, 2011 at 7:43pm officers were flagged down at 1200 South Keystone Avenue on a person being assaulted. Officers located German Rodriguez (hispanic male age 41) bleeding from two large lacerations on the back of his head. Witnesses stated that Rodriguez had been assaulted by three hispanic males carrying golf clubs. Officers located three hispanic males running in the 900 block of St. Paul Street that matched the broadcast description of the suspects involved. Rodriguez identified Jose Vinalay (white male age 29) as the male that struck him with a golf club. Vinalay was arrested for Battery and Criminal Recklessness. Rodriguez was treated by Medics but refused to be transported to the hospital.



Person to be Remembered

Samuel F.B. Morse (1791-1872)

Telegraph inventor Samuel F.B. Morse (1791-1872) was born in Charlestown, Massachusetts. He developed the idea of an electromagnetic telegraph in the 1830's and tapped out his first message "What hath God wrought?" in 1844 on the first telegraph line, running from Washington, D.C., to Baltimore. The construction of the first telegraph line was funded by Congress (\$30,000) after Morse failed to get any other financial backing. After Western Union was founded in 1856, telegraph lines were quickly strung from coast to coast in America.



This week in History

Library of Congress



The Library of Congress was established in Washington, D.C. on April 24th, 1800. It is America's oldest federal cultural institution and the world's largest library. Among the 145 million items in its collections are more than 33 million books, 3 million recordings, 12.5 million photographs, 5.3 million maps, 6 million pieces of sheet music and 63 million manuscripts. About 10,000 new items are added each day.

The Library's primary mission is researching inquiries made by members of Congress through the Congressional Research Service. Although it is open to the public, only Members of Congress, Supreme Court justices and other high-ranking government officials may check out books. As the *de facto* national library, the Library of Congress promotes literacy and American literature through projects such as the American Folklife Center, American Memory, Center for the Book and Poet Laureate.
