'Wow Derek, looks like you guys had one hell of a party last night,' the Postman comments.

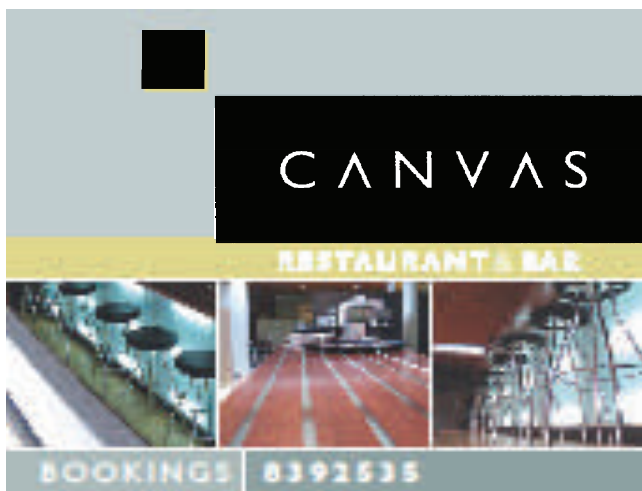

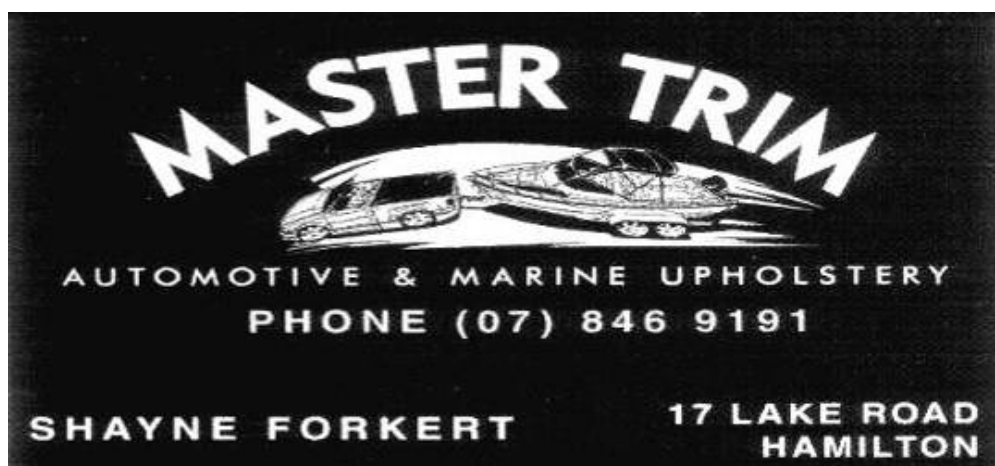

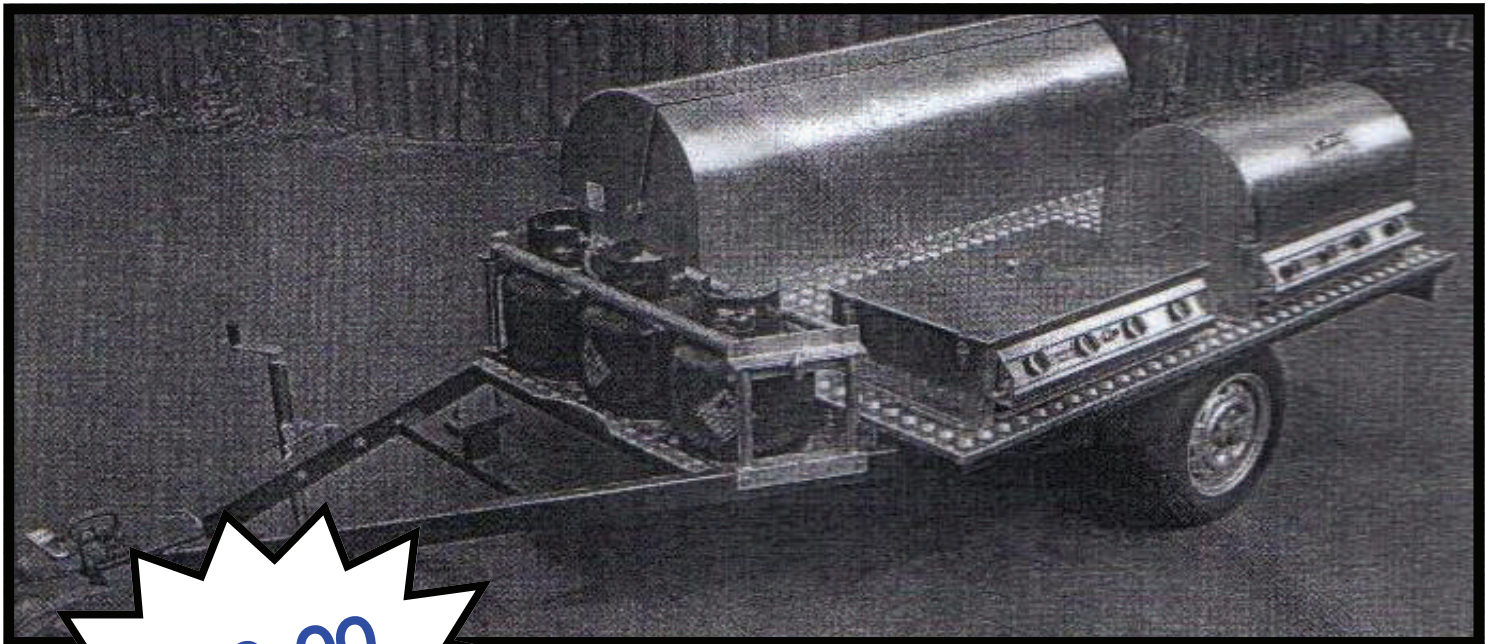
