President's Report

Okay there's heaps to talk about this month so before you go any further go put the kettle on make yourself a nice hot drink, okay put something "special" in it if you have to, then settle in for a long session.

First up, It's my pleasure to confirm that next Years Buccaneer One base tournament will once again be held at the Raglan Club from Thursday March 3rd - Saturday March 5th 2011. We had to move from our usual 3rd weekend in February spot due to Raglan being invaded by something like 1000 Harley Owners and all the accommodation was booked out already. We then had to avoid the 4th weekend in February because we would have had tides the same as this year and nobody wanted a repeat of that! So there you have it, Registration and skippers briefs will commence at 5pm on Wednesday night March 2nd. Start crossing your fingers now for fish and weather.

Coming up in May is the Hutchwilco Boatshow in Auckland from May 13-16, of particular interest to you all should be the New Zealand Sport Fishing Council stand which will include daily shows of Hiwi the Kiwi and sales of the new Hiwi the Kiwi books and CDs, and don't forget the chance to meet Hiwi the Kiwi himself. We'll also have the Decoro fish fighting machines including a contest between the super-city mayoral candidates on the fish fighting machines as well as numerous other forms of entertainment. You'll notice that a few of the other clubs have got parts of the stand and also their people attending their sections. I didn't even bother setting up anything for our club as we have our own boat show coming later in the year and I started making enquiries for that.

On our website (www.waikatosportfishing.co.nz/downloads.htm) you'll see copies of the minutes from the recent meeting for discussion around the formation of a peak body for representation of non-commercial fishing interests. As I said last newsletter the NZ Sport fishing council was invited to attend but did given the lack of information provided before hand and not our inability to review this information with our membership. So we sent a representative, Trish Rea of Moana consultants on our behalf to observe and take notes to be distributed to our membership. Those minutes are accessible from the web address above. Additionally you'll find an official copy of the minutes taken on behalf of the organisers, some dispute exists around which of the minutes provides the most accurate portrayal of the events of the meeting.

.I'll let you read the two versions and make your own conclusions. In essence the meeting discussed three things;

1. The proposal of the formation of a single umbrella organisation to represent the interests of non-commercial fishers to the government.
2. The funding for the formation of this body would most likely be provided by the government as "seed" funding.
3. Continued operation of the body would require ongoing funding that could be obtained through
4. Some form of voluntary membership structure
5. Some form of mandatory membership e.g licensing of saltwater fishers.

Other funding streams through charities, benefactors endowment funds etc.

My personal view is that a single body is not necessary, and that the energy that is currently being expended on having our voices heard to government is not likely to change and that having a peak body between us and the government just has our voice going through one more set of filters.

I've also said before that I have a personal view commercial and non-commercial fishers have the same vested interest in a fishery and it's actually them that stand to lose the most when a fishery is depleted. Anybody who remembers the state of the Hauraki Gulf Snapper fishery during the 80's, will also remember how easy it was to get the parties to agree on a strategy when they all agreed on the existence of a problem. Compare that fishery then with the fishery of today.

The current approach of attempting to statistically estimate biomasses of fish populations then attempting to statistically estimate the historical population with a view to inferring what the population will be in the future is simply put, a hiding to nowhere, in my opinion. Far too many statistical inferences results is too much room for arguing.

The amount of politics and emotion surrounding this whole issue of fisheries management to me has a distinctly strong smell of nest feathering by some parties. Something that I personally want nothing to do with.

I believe that rather than arguing over the accuracy of these statistical models, we just need somebody to stump up with the cash to fund an economic study of the value of the NZ Sport and recreational fishery. It's been done before and you'd think it was a case of refreshing the data and capturing any changes in the assumptions.

Certainly the study needs to be completed by a reputable research company, if not a similarly reputable university, which will require no small amount of cash. But if you're going to have an argument with people that are in it for the money, (commercial fishos) then you'd better be speaking in their language, the language of currency, cold hard cash!

So note the number of times I said "personally. The above is simply just that. Now I want to hear your views. When you receive the email with this newsletter attached, just simply hit reply and tell me what you want. Maybe I do lack the vision, or the full appreciation of what the future holds, or am simply misinformed, so let's have some consensus around this so I can take the message from our club to zone 6 and the NZSFC. In the absence of feedback I will assume you agree with my opinion and you're providing me with a mandate to assert my opinion to the NZSFC as being the view of the club. So if you don't agree, let's hear what you really think.

I have also announced to the committee and also advised zone 6 and the NZ Sportfishing council management committee that both myself and Stu Ross will be standing down as club delegates at this year's AGM. For Stu he's done this for something like 11 years and feels it's time to move on. For me, I've lasted 6 months and decided it's not really something I have any real interest in or the energy for it. So come our own AGM in August please consider becoming a club delegate for the Zone meetings. It has involved a meeting at Awakino every couple of months but very shortly we'll start using conference calls, which should be a great time saver.

Finally, a few of you have mentioned that you've had issues when you've approached other clubs for courtesy weighs. i.e you've caught a fish outside of Hamilton and you want to weigh it for our club. Some people have complained of weighmasters flatly refusing courtesy weighs while others try to charge you for the privilege of having your fish weighed. Whilst I've been unable to get details of anybody who has actually had this problem. I have checked with the NZ Sport Fishing council and it is part of their rules that affiliated clubs must provide a courtesy weigh service for all sport fish caught by members of other affiliated clubs and without any charges. So if you're at any other port, even Raglan and you have fish that need weighing then you are quite at liberty to ask the local weighmaster for a courtesy weigh. Having said all this don't expect a 24 hour service if it's later than say 7 or 8 pm you may have to wait for the next morning. Or if you're there at 2 pm and they're coming down at 4pm to weigh other fish, then I suggest you wait. If they flatly refuse or want to charge you then please provide the committee with names dates, times etc. and I'll report it to the NZ Sport fishing council management committee. Access to courtesy weighs is one of the main reasons we are affiliated to the NZ sport fishing council.

Okay that's about it for this month, so enjoy the boat show and hopefully some decent fishing and we'll catch up again next month.

The first hunter says "There's this old car transmission here, give me a hand and we'll throw it in and see".

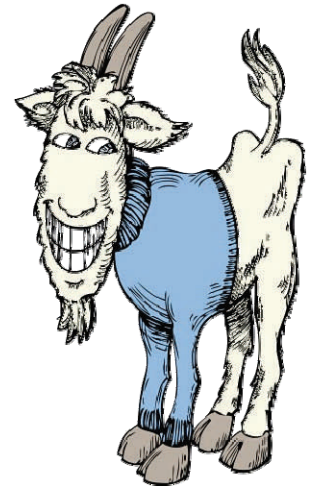
