# President's Report

Welcome to June! Things seem to be unusually exciting for this time of year.

On the fishing front, the snapper fishing is pretty fast and furious just about anywhere you look. Alistair Lane, Scotty Pritchard, my father in law Colin and myself took two boats up to Auckland a couple of weeks ago and fished the Noises on what looked like a fairly dodgy Saturday afternoon.

Swell map was predicting 15 knots during the first part of the day and dropping off to almost nothing as the day ended. Meanwhile, the now casting wind measurer at Bean rock was telling us it was blowing 25 knots. So the decision was made to take the drive up and see what it looked like when we got there, how's that for bold? Talk about a high risk strategy, we called the trip on and off about a dozen times on the way up and when we got there, decided we'd go because well, we were there anyway!

The wind sure was blowing at least 20 knots, but we had a remarkably smooth ride out to the Motuihe channel, and once there realised the wind wasn't as bad as it had been closer in. So we decided to keep going for destination number 1. Upon our arrival at the Noises another boat was already in our spot but luckily I realised it was another friend of mine, so we felt a whole lot better about anchoring in their burley trail.

Meanwhile Alistair and Scotty found a patch of fish a bit further out and dropped their anchor and burley there and then. The fishing was fast and furious, we had planned to stay there until dark but since we got there about two and everybody had their limit by just before 4, there seemed little sense in hanging around, there's only so many fish you can catch and release for the hell of it. All in all a great session at one of my favourite places. It still amazes me how good the fishing is in the Hauraki Gulf.

We had a great turn out of about 30 for our last club night to review our proposed business plan. In essence we introduced the idea of two new tournaments to be based out of our clubrooms in Hamilton along with our usual format of the Winter challenge, Shelly beach and the Raglan One base tournament. We also introduced our proposed vision and key themes for the club going forward. Lots of interesting discussion was held and we got some really interesting options going for future club nights and club events.

# Barbecue Tarakihi and Feta Salad



Fish, everyone's favourite dish! Especially when you barbecue a nice fillet of fish and serve it with baby new potatoes and a lovely feta salad.

**Time & Serves**  
**Serves: Serves 4**

## Ingredients

- 3 Tblsp **ETA Lite and Free Feta and Garlic Dressing**
- 1 tsp each finely grated lemon rind and chopped parsley
- 350g pack **Sealord Simply Natural Tarakihi Fillets**
- 4 small tomatoes

I hope you have the fulfilling life you always wanted. My lawyer said that the letter you wrote ensures you won't get a dollar from me.

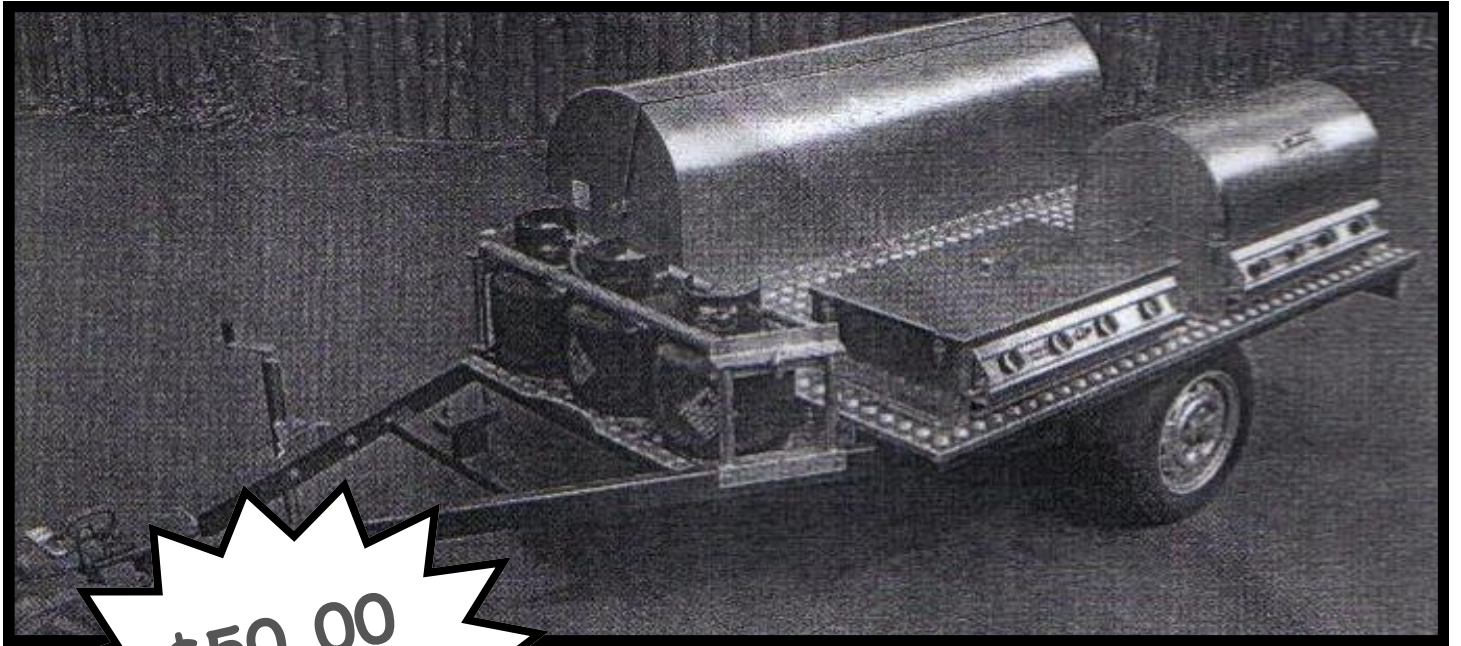
