President's Report

Well it's kind of a 2 for one deal from me this month. We'll start with a relatively short overview of what's been happening in the last few weeks and then I've included a copy of my annual report that was presented to the AGM.

The AGM went well, the dinner was awesome and the prize giving went very well. For the first time since I've been back involved with the club we have a full committee and plenty of offers to help with the various activities and events we have planned for the year ahead. You'll find details of the new committee elsewhere in this issue.

For those of you wondering, I still haven't snagged that fresh run Taupo trout yet. There do seem to be more fish being caught but frankly I haven't had a chance to get at them for a while apart from an hour spent at the Waitahanui mouth last Saturday afternoon, where as you've probably guessed nothing was being caught. The rivers are all very clear and haven't really had any rain for about a month now. Who'd have thought a drought in Winter! Even the recent snow seems to have bypassed those rivers. Will only be a few weeks before the snow on the mountain starts melting and it should be all on for young and old.

Was really cool to see a few brown trout take out some of the annual awards this year. It seems those Rendell boys, the big one included, are becoming quite versatile fishing and hunting machines!

I'm delighted to announce that Ross Christensen and the Fish City team have leapt right behind the proposed snapper tournament we announced at the AGM. So put a circle around these dates on your calendar, November 24th, 25th 26th and 27th, for our inaugural FISH CITY SNAPPER OPEN!

You can register at Fish City on Thursday November 24th up until 8 pm and start fishing fishing at midnight Thursday anywhere you want in New Zealand waters. Keep your heaviest fish on ice (but don't freeze them) and bring them back to the club rooms at Grantham street by 4 pm on the Sunday afternoon for the weigh-in. The prize giving will be held on the Sunday evening November the 27th. You don't have to be a member of our club or any club affiliated to the NZ Sport fishing Council. The tournament is open to WSFC members and members of the public alike, although a discounted entry fee will be available for WSFC members.

March 8th, 9th & 10th are the dates for Next year's One base that will once again be held at the Raglan club. It will be back to basics for this one, daily weather call made the morning of each tournament day and nightly prize giving's no matter what.

Don't forget the Shelley Beach family Tournament at Shelley Beach Top 10 Holiday Park Coromandel (<http://www.shellybeachcoromandel.co.nz>) again for November 4th 5th & 6th.

Finally we're honouring our sponsors differently this year , we're putting a sponsor board up in the club rooms to advertise our sponsors and highlight the fantastic contributions they make to our club. We're also going to be highlighting our sponsors on our website through our newsletter, and also by emailing their special deals as and when they arise to you. We have developed a Sponsorship prospectus for each tournament so that our sponsors know what to expected in return for their support. I've attached a copy of our sponsorship structure if you ,or somebody you know, would be interested in supporting the club through some level of sponsorship the please let Me , Alistair or Mark know.

So that's about it for me this month, here's what I said at the AGM about the year just gone.

It's been another good year for the club, in fact it's been an extremely good year for the club. We have :

- . Increased our membership from 170 to 202 members
- . Increased our Bank account with a \$3700 profit for the year.
- . Grown the Shelley beach family tournament from 50-60 participants.
- . Bought the TV for club night presentations and renting out to hall users for seminars etc.
- . Rejuvenated club nights with the February Open night and the Tristram marine visit being standout favourites.
- . Excellent prize spread at the One base
- . Completed our first ever Business plan
- . A Liquor license in place for club nights
- . Found a set of missing scales.
- . Taryn's awesome job as Treasurer, Newsletter publisher, and Web master.

We've had some frustrations as well:

- . One Base weather and related issues, and lack of contingency planning.
- . Lack of membership participation at some club events
- . Lack of membership engagement in club administration, even more workload for the willing few.
- . Low number of Catch cards for this year.
- . Weigh stations not organized during season
- . Fish city weigh station not equipped yet
- . Scales not at Raglan during season peak.

Membership growth is fundamental to our club's existence; the club exists because the members want something from it. We've done quite bit during the year in an effort to better meet the needs of our membership. The survey we ran early in the year told us that members really want more entertaining/ educational club nights and club activities such as tournaments.

We've run some really good club nights this year which have been well attended. In addition we have also got a bar license, it's always good to be able to enjoy a beer while watching a really interesting speaker. Now we're doing it legally! As a requirement of the liquor license we must also serve some food, so now we have club night pizzas, which also appear to be well received.

The Shelley Beach tournament was another standout success, not only did it grow by about another 10 participants but engages about a third of our members, which puts it equal to the one base in member participation.

The club doesn't run itself, it needs its members to be so enthused in what the club does that they'll not only hand over \$40 a year to be part of it but also that they want to be part of running it. So we've put together the business plan so that our members can see what the club stands for, and what we're doing to deliver value back to our members and the wider community of Hamilton.

We've outlined some fairly chunky goals for the club largely focussed on increasing revenues that we can then plough back into running more tournaments and eventually a junior angler program.

It all takes human resource. When I first joined the committee after the 2008 AGM, we had a paid Secretary/treasurer and nobody, I mean nobody stood for the job of President! During that year we had negative cash on several occasions and I seriously wondered if we still had a viable club. Clearly, we couldn't afford the luxury of paid Secretary/ Treasurer and she stood down at the 2009 AGM. We made a \$4500 Loss during that year. In 2009 we had Leandre doing secretarial duties and Maylene doing the treasury role and we pretty much broke even for the year. This year we've had Leandre carry on with the secretarial role, and Taryn running Treasury, the newsletter, and the Website along with studying full time and working at Countdown, we've made a \$3700 profit.

We're a small club by the standards of most fishing clubs and we have the hall which is both a blessing and a curse from a revenue perspective. It requires more resource to run it than a club of our size can afford, but it also generates quite a nice little bundle of revenue for the club which we use for subsidising prizes for our tournaments which in turn helps us make money to support the operation of the club and maintenance of the building.

In my view it would be a sad thing to have to employ a paid secretary/treasurer again. It represents about \$6000 of club revenue for which we see very little real benefit. My preference is to see as much of our revenue ploughed back into things that our members can really benefit from, and in my mind spending in this direction just doesn't cut it. However, if we can't fill these roles with elected volunteers then that's what we'll have to do.

So we need your help, you'll see later this evening we're introducing a new tournament which will need some people to help organise. We also want to promote the hall a lot harder than we have done so to date. We think it's not only a great venue for club nights and functions, but also a great conference venue for the various businesses around town. We need some help to make this happen.

Despite all the highlights, the year had a couple of low lights the main one for me was the One Base Tournament. The issue was not so much that we got 3 days of crap weather, which could happen anytime; the issue was that we didn't have any contingency plans for such a situation, despite the remote chance that it could happen. The lack of contingency plans forced us to make decisions on the fly about what to do with 3 days of crap weather when it happened right on our tournament. When you do that you're on thin ice because everybody has an opinion, and you're never going to please everybody, and we didn't.

Next year's tournament will return to the way it's always been run, the One Base at the Raglan club, daily weather calls made on the morning and daily prize draws no matter what. The Raglan One base has a strong following of loyal supporters.

That's their tournament for the year and that's the only place they want to fish. Changing away from that jeopardises the tournament and the benefits the clubs gets from the tournament. It needs to stay as what it's always been: The Waikato Sport fishing Club hosting the One Base Tournament at Raglan.

But it's also not everybody's cup of tea, less than 30% of our club membership has fished the One Base Tournament over the last 3 years. We really need to engage the rest of the membership so we need to do more. Tonight we're introducing the Snapper Slammer Tournament, we hope you'll like it and support it, it's everything the One Base isn't.

The second low-light is that we haven't had a lot of fish weighed this year. There's a few reasons for that;

1. There was a time when there were no scales at Raglan, the only way you could get fish caught at Raglan weighed was to contact me or Mark to get access to the scales that were in Hamilton.
2. Despite our best efforts we just haven't got the Fish City weigh station operational. Frankly we just haven't had the time.
3. A large number of fish weighed by the club for the club are caught during the One Base tournament. We didn't fish the tournament this year so less fish got entered.
4. The courtesy weigh system is not well understood. Additionally, some other clubs are still making courtesy weighs difficult. They are operating outside of their obligations as affiliated members of the NZ Sport fishing council when they do this and I strongly encourage you to report them to me or directly to the NZSFC yourself.

The scales are back at the Raglan Club, you just need to get the keys from the bar staff when you have a fish to weigh. We've found a set of scales that went missing quite some years ago and are having them re-calibrated they will go to Fish city along with a new weigh board for the new season.

Our focus for the New Year will be;

1. Getting the new Tournament up & Running
2. Continuing with fantastic club nights.
3. Establishing some more documentation around club policies.
4. Running the One base tournament the way you've always liked it.
5. Increasing hall revenues, by marketing it as a conference venue.
6. Resurfacing the Dance floor
7. Replacing all the signage on the clubrooms.

We've really worked hard for the club this year.

First and foremost Taryn Olsen deserves mention for his stellar efforts, he's taken on a lot this year and he's done a damn good job of it.

Mark Olsen, continues to be the operational kingpin for the club, if it needs doing or organising then Mark's right there calling the shots and making it happen, it's what he enjoys doing and he does it so very well.

Alistair Lane, organising the business plan and trying to find out what the membership wants is no mean feat but he did it and I think you'll love the result. Please show your appreciation by getting in behind and supporting it.

Scott Pritchard, has been a complete breath of fresh air this year, the Fish Sculptures he made for the raffles at the one base along with his tireless cold calling on new Sponsors showed us just how much we've come to rely on our existing sponsors and just how many other Sponsors are out there keen to support the club.

Tony Brinkworth; Thanks for his tireless efforts as records officer. He's also been an active member of the committee since 2003 and is a loyal Major sponsor of One Base.

Leandre Sharp for her fantastic involvement in the organisation of the One Base and support wherever else her extremely busy schedule has allowed.

Alex McDonald has done a great job filling as Hall Manager when Jill has been on Holidays.

Geoff Flower has been our "go-to" man for all sorts of job especially around the One Base.

And last but certainly not least, while not a committee member, Jill Hobden is doing a superb job in managing the hall hire. We've had some great feedback from some of our clients this year about Jill's fair and no nonsense approach when it comes to the hall being left in the condition in which it was rented. Thanks Jill.

So there you have it another year gone in the life of The Waikato Sport fishing Club and yes it *has* been a good one.

Or if I had asked for a Taco, would you ask if I was Mexican?"

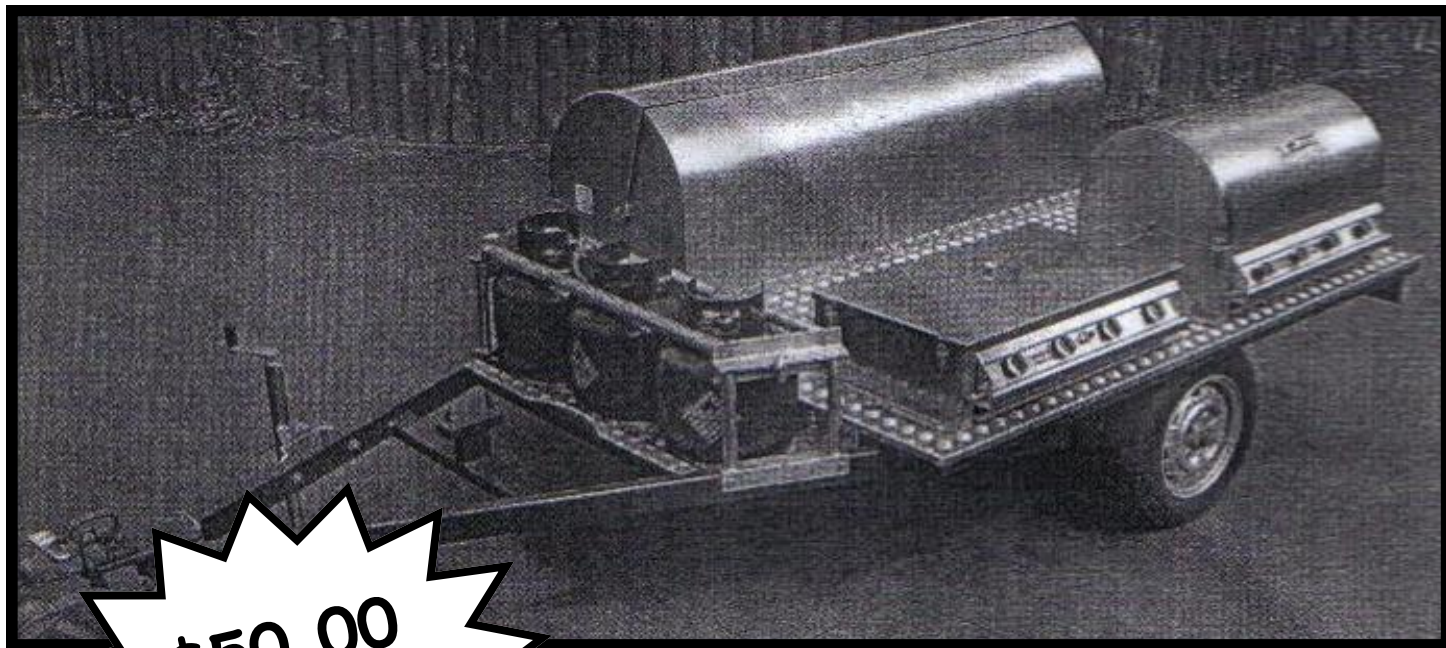
