Had a successful charter with Supreme Sheetmetals staff on Sunday the 3rd. Caught our limit of Snapper with the biggest being 8lb ranging down to 32cm schoolies. Fished various areas of the south-west reef averaging 65 meters depth. Caught some good size Blue Cod. The Skipper was keen to move location each time the fishing slowed down or the Barracuda turned up. We seemed to have a good bite time each time we moved which kept the tally up for the day.

This Month's Recipe

Smoked Fish Cannelloni



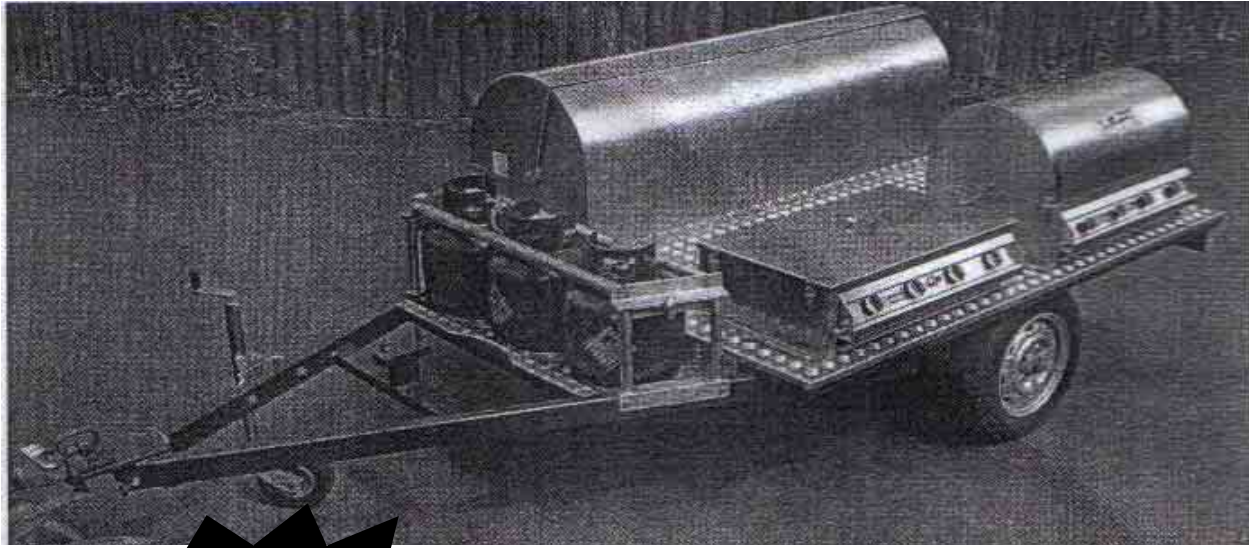
2 tablespoons butter, 1 red onion, finely diced, 1 clove garlic, chopped, 2 leeks - finely sliced, Salt and pepper, Olive oil, 1/2 cup white wine, 1 1/2 cups cream, 1/2 cup chives, chopped, 1/2 cup flat-leaf parsley, - chopped, 2 tablespoons thyme leaves, 1/2 cup Parmesan cheese, 6 fresh pasta sheets - boiled in salt water and cooled on a tray brushed with olive oil, 500g smoked fish, - cut into small strips, 2 whole sweet corn kernels removed

1. Heat the butter in a large saucepan and cook the red onion and garlic for 2 minutes. Add the sliced leek, season with salt and pepper and allow to cook on low heat until soft and limp.
2. Turn the heat up to medium and add the white wine. Cook until almost all the wine has evaporated. Add the cream and continue to cook until almost all the liquid has gone. Turn the heat to low and cook until completely dry (being careful not to burn it). Add the chives, parsley, thyme and parmesan. Allow to cool.
3. Lay a sheet of plastic wrap on the bench and lightly brush with olive oil. Lay one sheet of pasta dough flat on the wrap. Spoon 4-5 tablespoons of the leek mixture onto the pasta, top with smoked fish and carefully roll up into a cannelloni shape. Be careful not to let too much of the mixture escape out the sides.
4. Tightly wrap with plastic wrap around the cannelloni, twisting the ends like a lolly wrapper. Repeat with the remaining pasta sheets. Refrigerate for 1 hour to allow to set
5. Steam the cannelloni for 8-10 minutes until heated through.

To serve: Place cannelloni in the bottom of each serving bowl. Spoon some beurre blanc on and around it and finish with a good dollop of tomato fondue.

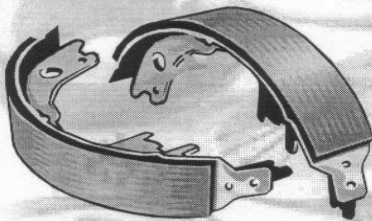
